Our event season is enjoying Sommerpause, like most of you-but behind the scenes we are very busy lining up our autumn events, re-working our Web site, and preparing the new Membership Directory for printing.

Long hoped-for changes to the GABC Web site coming soon...

When GABC was a smallish club of 90 members (not that long ago), it was easy for the board members and executive director to be the primary contact points for introductions between members. It was easy for members to find each other at events with smaller groups. However, in the last seven years, our organization has tripled in size! We have searched for actionable ways that members can use to find, help, and interact directly with each other - 365 days a year—without waiting for a chance meeting at an event or introduction by a board member.

We think we've found some answers.

The database of the new Web site will be vastly improved and easier to search. Members will have new options such as 1) adding their logo, 2) adjusting their profile directly from their device as often as they want, and 3) offering their services and promoting their special events to the general public. Because GABC is considered the premier organization for German-American business in New England, our site gets a lot of Google hits...and our members will benefit directly from this.

We've heard from several members who want an informal, but trustworthy online forum where they can ask other members specific questions and get immediate answers. Our Executive Director Marian LeMay usually fields these questions, but even she is sometimes stumped. We are exploring ways in which a new Facebook group can serve this need. Stay tuned.

Tapetenwechsel... After completing his 3-year posting here in Boston, German Consul General, Rolf Schütte has returned to Germany, with expectations of being posted next to Marseille, France. We wish the Consul continued success in his endeavors on French turf. The new Consul General will be Dr. Ralf Horlemann, who has made major contributions to formulating and developing Germany's policy in conflict prevention and management. Traditionally, the German Consul General is an honorary member of the GABC Board of Directors, lending valuable support at events, and opening doors to important contacts in the German business community. In addition to the support of the Consul, the Deputy Consul is traditionally a very active member of the GABC Board of Directors, attending our monthly meetings-Deputy Consul General Helmut Landes has been serving us in this role admirably since his arrival in Boston last August 2014.

Boston-based Taurus develops America's First Zero-Energy Community in Texas

GABC Corporate Member **Taurus Investment Holdings, LLC**, is developing a completely energy self-sufficient community at "Whisper Valley" in Austin, Texas. The project includes 7,500 single and multi-family homes and more than 200,000 square meters of office and retail space. All of the units have geothermal and solar systems and are fitted with SmartHome technologies. This is the largest project of its kind anywhere in the United States. Planned investment in the pilot project amounts to around €2 billion. High net worth German and American investors are supplying up to €200 million.

Taurus has partnered with the leading technology companies **Bosch**, **BASF** and **Google Fiber** on the project development. Partnership agreements have been signed between these companies and the Taurus subsidiary, **EcoSmart Solution LP** (ESS). Bosch is supplying energy-efficient geothermal heat exchangers, warm water systems and household equipment. Among the products supplied by BASF are construction materials, including, for the first time in the United States, its patented, energy-saving HP+ wall system. Whisper Valley also has the privilege of being the first community in which every single building is connected to Google Fiber's 1GB/s network.

Taurus has developed a novel approach to financing the project that drastically reduces the traditionally high initial investment needed to build environmentally-friendly homes. This means that "green" houses are available at prices ranging from \$175,000 to \$300,000—prices that are affordable for a huge section of the American population.
